

Point of View

A story can be told from different points of view. It can be written in the first, second or third person.

I was going to the funfair today. I was so excited!

Have you ever wondered what life would be like as a superhero?

The boys ran from the house screaming. Riley was terrified.

First Person

If a story is written in first person, it is written as if it is written by the main character.

It describes what 'I' am doing, seeing, feeling, hearing and so on.

It uses the pronoun 'I'

For example: Last year, I went to Spain with my family. I loved it!

Other pronouns used in the first person: my me mine we our ours us

Second Person

If a story is written in second person, the story talks to the reader directly.

It uses the pronoun 'you'.

The second person is used a lot non-fiction as well as in fiction texts. It is often used in instructions!

For example: Before you begin, make sure that you have all of the tools listed above. Other pronouns used in the second person:

your yours

Third Person

If a story is written in third person, it is written as if a narrator is telling the story about different characters.

It will use the character's name or pronouns such as 'he', 'she' and 'they'.

Other pronouns used in the third person:

her/hers his theirs

For example: Michelle sped off at top speed and was soon in first place. She couldn't believe that she was going to win!
