Reading/Writing/ Phonics

Read 'Zog' ever day by Julia Donaldson each day to your child. The animated version can be found on BBC iPlayer at the moment if you don't have a copy.

Literacy-Look at the image named Tuesday Literacy from the story Zog. Can you write a sentence about what is happening in the image? Don't forget to reflect on your phonic sounds, fingers spaces and full stops.

Phonics- In the story Zog there are a lot of different rhyming words. On the Tuesday phonics sheet can you match the rhyming words? Can you add any other rhyming words that you know?
