Home learning tasks-guide for grown ups- 31.3.20

Please DO NOT feel like you have to do all of these tasks every day. Some days you might do all of them and some days you may not do any. These are just some ideas to keep you going for when your child ready and happy to learn.

Phonics

Learn the alphabet song-Using the alphabet frieze attached and images of animals the children can indicate which one is a cat, dog and cow and then what sound each one makes: meow, woof, moo etc. Reiterating that one of the animals is a cat and it makes the sound meow. Display a letter (e.g. t) and tell the children that it is a t (say its name and stands for the sound /t/ (say its sound). When you learn the alphabet encourage the children to say the name of the letter and the sound it makes.

Reading

If you have some suitable books at home, then try to read once a day with your child. Give them LOADS of praise and encouragement. If you want, you could video them reading and upload it onto tapestry so that we can give your child some positive feedback!

Writing

Can you write a short message to Mrs Bishop, Mrs Michica or Mrs Reed? You could tell us what you have been up to at home and what fun you have had with your families. Your parents can upload the message on tapestry for us to read.

Understanding the world/Expressive Art and design/Communication and Language

If you have access to an outside space or on your daily walks, look out for signs of Spring. What do you notice about the trees? Which flowers can you see? Can you hear the birdsong? Talk to your family about what you have noticed and how it is different to Winter.
