WALT – find o'clock times on a clock

Can you match the things you do in the day to the approximate time they happen?



Play what's the time Mr Wolf



For the rest of this lesson (and the rest of the week) you will need a clock that you can move the hands on.

In the response section there is a paper clock you can make.

Step 1 – What numbers are on a clock?

A clock has numbers 1 – 12 on it. The top number is always 12 and the bottom number is always 6.

Can you stick the rest of the numbers in the Correct places?



Step 2 – the hands

There is a long hand and a short hand.

The short hand shows the hour. The long hands shows the minutes.

Can you colour your hour hand red and Your minute hand blue.





When the minute hand is at the 12 that means it has gone all the way round the clock meaning an hour has past.

Each time it reaches the 12, the hour hand will be on the next number showing the next hour.

When the minute hand is on the 12 this means it is an o'clock time. The clock to the left shows us that it is 3 o'clock because the hour hand is on the 3 and the minute hand is on the 12.
