## Step 1: What is a Vowel?

### Teaching Note:

As the focus of this step is the recognition of vowels and vowel sounds, we have included familiar words from the Year 2 spelling list in the Expected level.

### Differentiation:

**Developing** Questions to support identifying and using vowels in CVC/CVCC/CCVC words. Includes some pictorial support.

**Expected** Questions to support identifying and using vowels in words. Most words from Year 2 spelling list with some words from the Year 3 and 4 spelling list. Includes more than one vowel per word and some pictorial support.

**Greater Depth** Questions to support identifying and using vowels in words. Words from Year 3 and 4 spelling list. Includes words with more than one vowel and no pictorial support.
