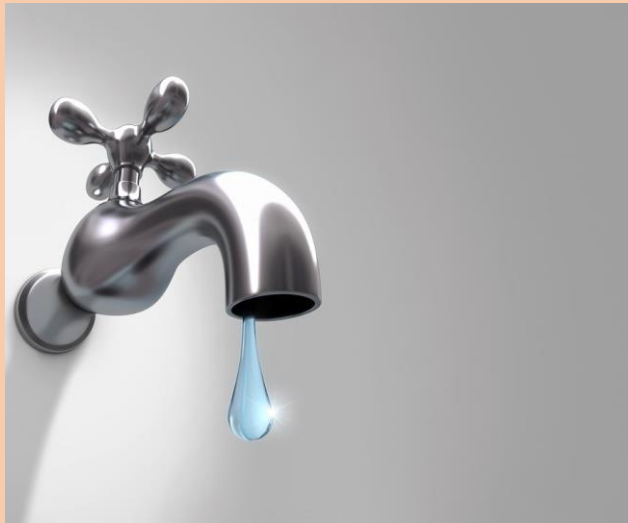
WALT – write a story
