Dear Parents and Carers,

Thank you to everyone for supporting the FWR Rudolph Run event at the weekend. It was a wonderful way to have the school community come together and start to celebrate the Festive season. Thank you to the FWR team for a great day.

As we look towards the end of Term 2, we must continue to be vigilant help to keep the school community safe. We ask that any visitors into the school building wear face masks (unless medically exempt) and maintain social distancing. We are reminding the children to use good hand hygiene and are keeping the school building well ventilated. Please ensure your child is wearing appropriate layers each day and always brings their coat to school. We will continue to monitor the temperature of classrooms and infection rates across the school and locally.

At the time of writing, we are still planning to celebrate our Christmas events in person but please be aware these plans may change closer to the time if necessary. All tickets for the Nativity and Carols will be given out on Friday, 10th December. I have listed the events below with the organisational details which I hope will be helpful. Please note, there will be no after school clubs (apart from Pioneer Childcare) running in the final week of term.

Monday, 13th December, 2pm – EYFS and KS1 Nativity

This is a ticketed event. We ask that all visitors wear face masks whilst inside the school building (unless medically exempt) and maintain social distancing. We would also appreciate all visitors to take a LFT before they visit the site.

Please ensure any requests for tickets not given by today are emailed to me (<u>head@westernroad.e-sussex.sch.uk</u>) as soon as possible.

For those of you attending the Nativity, you are able to take your child home as soon as they have changed back into their school uniform from their costume. Siblings may also be taken at this time. For those of you not attending this performance, your child should be collected at 3.15pm as usual.

Tuesday, 14th December, 9.15am – EYFS and KS1 Nativity

This is a ticketed event. We ask that all visitors wear face masks whilst inside the school building (unless medically exempt) and maintain social distancing. We would also appreciate all visitors to take a LFT before they visit the site.

Please ensure any requests for tickets not given by today are emailed to me (<u>head@westernroad.e-sussex.sch.uk</u>) as soon as possible.

After the Nativity, the children wil return to class as usual.

Wednesday, 15th December – Christmas Lunch

This week we had our first Maths assembly celebrating children's achievements in Times Tables Rock Stars and Numbots. We will be having whole school Maths assemblies every fortnight, however we will still hand out certificates in class on the alternative weeks. Willow Class won the trophy for the highest score and Jonah from Year 2 achieved the highest accuracy in the whole school. We are very proud of all the efforts of all of the children in Maths in and outside of school!





News from EYFS (Silver Birch Class)

Last week the children in Silver Birch have been interested to learn about Buddism. We then practised various mindfulness activities including yoga, observing nature, threading (our spin on sewing), listening to relaxing music and a range of painting techniques. This week we continued our topic 'Celebrations' and have been learning about Judiasm and finding out about Hanukkah. The children enjoyed hearing about how it is celebrated in many homes around the world and even had a go at making their own dreidels!

In literacy we have been working hard to develop our knowledge of phonics. We have been learning to recognise many letters as well as using them to read and write 3-letter words. In addition, we have continued our Talk for Writing work based on the poem 'Give yourself a Hug' by Grace Nichols where we have innovated our own versions of the poem.

In maths we have been working on the concept of 'one more' and 'more than'. The children found this particularly fun when comparing quantities in the context of tasty food!



News from Year 1 (Elm Class)

We have been learning more about Space this week. We had the visit from the Planetarium which was amazing. The children found out lots of new information so please ask them! We created our own moon phases using black and white beans. We have built a large rocket in the garden and created our own smaller junk model rockets. We also painted our planets. We have continued to read our Talk for Writing text 'Beegu' and next week we will be innovating the story.



News from Year 2 (Cherry Class)



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News from Year 3 (Larch Class)

In Year 3 we have been thinking about what 'rural' means and landscapes this week. We were inspired by Monet to create our own landscapes using finger painting!





News from Year 4 (Willow Class)

Year 4 have been focusing on The Great Wave in Art, linking to their weather topic. They learnt to create the outline of the waves using a tutorial. After this, they spent a morning used mixed media (bubble wrap and paint, tissue paper and glue, and chalk/pastels) to create their own versions of the picture. They look amazing, and some children have even had a go at making another version at home too.



News from Year 5 (Elder Class)

Year 5 have created a class poem about Mercury, as part their Space topic. The children worked together to write the poem, thinking of ideas and editing throughout the process:

<u>Mercury</u>

Her face is crisp like toasted crumpets, silent crackles and muffled trumpets. Bumpy like a volcano rim, her heart is bright but her light is dim. She helps the stars to find their way, All along the Milky Way. She is a warm crackly fire, her popularity soars even higher. Silently, sneaky she tiptoes past, Venus's glare and silky mast. She is old and kind, but still has a good mind. She plays hide and seek with the planets and stars, behind Venus she hides from Mars. A metallic tweed skirt and silvery top, hair so wild like a scruffy mop. Young in face and old wrinkly eyes, Down in the dark she sometimes cries.

She dislikes Saturn because he has rings, and so many other fantastic things. Like an armadillo her shell is strong, she quietly sings her midnight song.

We had a fantastic experience, learning all about our solar system and the properties of the planets. These were brought to life in the incredible 3D planetarium dome!

Year 6 have been very busy learning all about the famous historical invasions from the Vikings back in 793AD, especially focusing on the invasion on Holy island, Lindisfarne.
