Transition

Unfortunately, due to the current Government guidelines, we were unable to host the New To EYFS parents and carers session this week. However, the families joining Western Road have been sent transition books for parents and children and there are also videos of the EYFS staff on the website. The new intake have been invited to join Miss Jones and Mrs Michica on the school field in small groups for their Teddy Bears' Story Time sessions. We have also released the staggered start dates for those children for September 2020.

As part of the transition into new year groups, we would like to invite Years Two-Five children onto the school field at staggered times/dates within the parameters of social distancing and Government guidelines. **Transition dates will be released as soon as possible.** The aim of the sessions would be to say 'goodbye' to the current class teachers and 'hello' to class teachers for the new academic year. It will also give you the opportunity to meet your child's new class teacher and ask any questions. We ask that you stick to allotted time slots given to ensure the safety of everyone involved. **Please note, children will not be permitted within the white gate (eg, to use the toilet facilities) during these sessions.** If you are unable to attend those sessions, we will email out any relevant information.

Patina

Unfortunately, the Year Six Patina parade due to take place on Friday, 3rd July has been postponed until the next academic year. However, the Year Six class will mark the occasion with a costumed parade on the field (with social distancing between the two pods) and picnic in the afternoon of Monday, 6th July.
