Literacy- The 'Prince Cinders' story is an adaption of the fairy-tale Cinderella. There are many traditional and fairy tales you have heard at school and at home. Could you adapt your favourite story? You could change the main character or the setting e.g. My favourite is Little Red Riding Hood. I would change the setting so instead of the story happening woods it will be set on a Tropical Island and the wolf would be a pirate trying to steal the jewellery that I was taking to my Granny. You all have fantastic imaginations and I am sure you have some great ideas.
