Home learning tasks- guide for grown ups- 30.4.20

Reading/Writing/ Phonics

Read 'Zog' with your child by Julia Donaldson and Axel Scheffler. If you do not have a copy, then you can watch the BBC version on BBC iplayer or Amazon Prime. You can also listen to the story read aloud on You Tube- https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=qZqFqI0MAfU

Also, see if you can find any other books about Knights, Princesses or Dragons. Discuss how the characters in the different texts are similar/ different. For example, how is the princess in Zog different from Cinderella?

Can you be a teacher and open a dragon school? Make some gold stars for your family members and write on them something they have done really well. For example you could write- Well Done Daddy for making a yummy lunch! Or you could teach your brother or sister to be a dragon and write- "Well Done you are a Champion Roarer!" Encourage your child to use a Capital letter at the start of the sentence and a full stop at the end. You could also introduce an exclamation mark and discuss when you might use one.

Phonics- Have a go at the attached worksheet. Match the picture to the word. For an extra challenge, can you write a short sentence containing any of these words?

Continue to get your child to read with you as much as possible. You can create an account on the Oxford Owl website and access lots of free ebooks. We would have been reading book bands 1,2,3 mostly at school. https://home.oxfordowl.co.uk/books/free-ebooks/
