Example

Golden Eagle

What do they look like?

A golden Eagle found in the UK will have a wingspan of roughly 204-220cm! These birds are dark brown, with lighter golden-brown plumage on their heads and necks. Males and females look similar, but females are much larger than males. Females weigh from 3940 to 6125 g. Males weigh from 3000 to 4475 g.

Where do they live?

In the UK, golden eagles are only found in Scotland. They are the biggest eagle in North America. Golden Eagles like to live in open country. They do not like developed areas such as towns and villages. Lots of them can be found in mountains up to 12,000 feet, canyonlands, and riverside cliffs and bluffs. Golden Eagles nest on cliffs and steep escarpments in grassland, chapparal, shrubland, forest, and other vegetated areas.


What do they eat?

Golden Eagles prey mainly on small to medium-sized mammals, including hares, rabbits, ground squirrels, prairie dogs, and marmots. These eagles are also capable of taking larger bird and mammal prey, including cranes, swans and deer. They also catch fish, rob nests, and steal food from other birds.
