Governors Visit: Some of the Governors came to school last week to see how well children are doing in their maths. They looked at children's books and spoke with some of the teachers. They were very pleased with what they saw. Thank you Governors for giving up your time and coming into school.

Attendance and Punctuality Update: To clarify the message that went in the last Newsletter. We are advised that some evidence (note from G.P. / Appointment Card etc.) should be provided if children are off more than 2 - 3 days due to illness **if** their attendance record indicates:

- 1. consecutive 'broken weeks of attendance' or
- 2. overall school attendance percent is below expected level.

The school will contact you for this if required. If children's attendance is good, and they have an illness lasting 2 - 3 days or more, then this further confirmation may not be necessary.

There are still a number of children who are consistently arriving late for school. The gates open at 8.40am; teachers are in the playground at 8.50am, and the bell rings for the start of the school day at 8.55am - all children should be in their class (Reception, Year 1 & 2) or their class line (Year 3 - 6) at this time. ESBAS will in coming in to school to do a 'late sweep' at some stage soon to see if this has improved. ESBAS offer lots of advice and guidance to both schools and parents; please do let us know if you would like to speak with someone about issues relating to pupil attendance and punctuality.
