Coordinating Conjunctions

Coordinating conjunctions join independent clauses and sentences.



My cat loves having his tummy tickled **but** he hates getting his claws trimmed. My cat likes playing **yet** he gets frustrated if we play for too long. My cat loves tuna **or** ham for dinner. I was late to school, **for** I lost my shoes. He was neither happy **nor** sad.



Subordinating Conjunctions

Subordinating conjunctions join independent, complete clauses to a dependent clause. The clause that follows a subordinating conjunction is less important than the main clause. (A clause is a part of a sentence that contains a verb).

although, as, before, once, though, until, whether, since, because, even though, before, provided, after, whenever, once, so that

Bella repainted her bedroom because she didn't like pink anymore. I was excited to visit the museum, **although** I wasn't sure they had my favourite artefacts.

Cleopatra was excited to be queen, **provided** that she had a palace. Tutankhamun's mummy was taken from his tomb, **once** it had been discovered.



Correlative Conjunctions

Correlative conjunctions are pairs of conjunctions used in a sentence to join different words or groups of words in a sentence together. Correlative conjunctions are generally used to link two or more words of equal importance within the sentence itself.

neither/nor

just as/so

either/or

both/and

not only/but

whether/or

Sam enjoyed both the film and the popcorn.

Causal Conjunctions

Causal conjunctions are words and phrases which are used to introduce a cause, reason or explanation for a given action within a sentence. For instance 'because of', 'due to' and 'as a consequence of' are all causal conjunctions which link an action to its cause.
