## **<u>Reading/Writing/ Phonics</u>**

Literacy- What would happen if a dragon came to visit you at your house? Would you scare him away? Would he be a friendly dragon? You could scribe your child's ideas for a story entitled 'When the dragon came to tea.' Remind them you need to add certain words and phrases to make it a better story. You need openers and time connectives- Once upon a time, Next, Finally, Happily ever after. You also need exciting adjectives to describe people and places- like terrifying, delicious or gruesome. Maybe your child could add pictures for the story to make a story map or you could make a video of you telling your story together.
