Developing

1a. Sentence 2 is the odd one out because it has been written in the present perfect tense. Sentences 1 and 3 are in the simple past tense.

2a. Various answers, for example: Present Perfect – Mia has painted a picture at school. Simple Past – Sam painted a picture of a tree.

3a. Kai is incorrect because he has written 'have' before 'looked' so his sentence is in the present perfect tense.

Expected

4a. Sentence 3 is the odd one out because it has been written in the present perfect tense. Sentences 1 and 2 are in the simple past tense.

5a. Various answers, for example: Present Perfect – Jordan has drawn a picture of his house. Simple Past – Jess drew a picture for her dad.

6a. Isaac is incorrect because 'throw' in the present perfect tense is 'thrown'.

Greater Depth

7a. Sentence 3 is the odd one out because it has been written in the present perfect tense. Sentences 1 and 2 are in the simple past tense.

8a. Various answers, for example: Present Perfect – Mrs Gregory has taught us for two years. Simple Past – My mum taught me to be kind to others.

9a. Greg is incorrect because 'forgive' in the present perfect tense is 'forgiven'.

<u>Developing</u>

1b. Sentence 1 is the odd one out because it has been written in the simple past tense. Sentences 2 and 3 are in the present perfect tense.

2b. Various answers, for example: Present Perfect – Jake has listened to their new song. Simple Past – Lily listened to the teacher.

3b. Lila is incorrect because she has not written 'have' before 'boiled' so her sentence is in the simple past tense.

Expected

4b. Sentence 3 is the odd one out because it has been written in the simple past tense. Sentences 1 and 2 are in the present perfect tense.

5b. Various answers, for example: Present Perfect – Melissa has sung in the choir for years. Simple Past – Katie sang the national anthem at the football match.

6b. Kylie is incorrect because 'make' in the simple past tense is 'made'.

Greater Depth

7b. Sentence 1 is the odd one out because it has been written in the simple past tense. Sentences 2 and 3 are in the present perfect tense.

8b. Various answers, for example: Present Perfect – I have studied English for many years. Simple Past – Bella studied for her Maths test.

9b. Rosie is incorrect because 'light' in the simple past tense is 'lit'.
