Greater Depth Find pronouns in a paragraph of multi-clause sentences with subordination and identify them as personal or possessive. Includes singular and plural pronouns.

Questions 2, 5 and 8 (Reasoning)

Developing Explain whether a singular pronoun is referring to a certain noun in a singleclause sentence.

Expected Explain whether a singular or plural pronoun is referring to a certain noun in a multi-clause sentence with coordination.

Greater Depth Explain whether a singular or plural pronoun is referring to a certain noun in a multi-clause sentence with subordination.

Questions 3, 6 and 9 (Reasoning)

Developing Find and explain the mistake in a single-clause sentence containing only singular pronouns.

Expected Find and explain the mistake in a paragraph containing multi-clause sentences with coordination, and singular and plural pronouns.

Greater Depth Find and explain the mistake in a paragraph containing multi-clause sentences with subordination, and singular and plural pronouns.
