News from the Governors

We wanted to take this opportunity of the last newsletter of the calendar year to bring you up to date on the work of the governing body. Coinciding with a restructure and reorganization of the governing body, after an eventful 3 ½ years, Ken Caplan will be stepping down as the Chair of Governors to become the Vice Chair. Jonathan Sharpe (Community Governor) and Sam Caughey (Parent Governor) will become the Co-Chairs as of January. Rather than working through a committee system, each governor has been asked to take on designated roles, like Health and Safety, Safeguarding, Pupil Progress Data Tracking, etc. This will help to streamline our oversight efforts and play to the strengths of individual governors. Although we have dedicated focus areas, issues like Finance and Budget in particular continue to remain the responsibility of the whole governing body.

As you will have seen from the Minutes of the Parents' Forum meetings, we will begin the process of recruiting a permanent Headteacher in late January with support from East Sussex County Council. We are confident and optimistic that we will identify an appropriate candidate for the role. To align with the required notice periods, our aim is to appoint in April with a start date set for the beginning of the next academic year.

As you will know, we are in the "Ofsted window" which means that we could be visited by Ofsted at any point in the coming months. Whilst we are very confident in the school's direction of travel, there are, as always, things to work on and improve. We would value your views and opinions and would encourage you to use Parent View (the online survey with a link from the school's website) to provide feedback. This will be the first area that Ofsted look at before coming to visit. Governors will also be keen to meet you at the next Parents' Evening, should you wish to ask any questions or provide any feedback directly.

We remain grateful for all the different ways that parents and carers contribute to the school. Please continue to join in and support the Friends of Western Road. The FOWR Artists and Makers event, for example, provides invaluable financial support at a time when budgets continue to dwindle. Along with your individual contributions helping out with various aspects of improving our school, both the FOWR and the Parents' Forum make a real difference in ensuring that Western Road remains a community school with the children at the centre.
