Dear Parents and Carers,

Welcome back to Term 2! I hope you all had a restful half-term in preparation for a busy term ahead! This week has included learning about the origins of Bonfire Night and how to be safe around fireworks (please see email sent earlier this week). I hope you all have a wonderful evening celebrating the Lewes Bonfire Night. It was lovely to see so many children in bonfire jumpers today!



Next week we have Kittles Photographers visiting on Monday (please see email sent earlier this week) and Forest School will continue for Years 2 and 3.

Andrew Gunn, an ESCC computing consultant, will visit Years 4 – 6 on Friday, 12<sup>th</sup> November to hold workshops about online safety. We will sent out any relevant information following these workshops in due course.

### Anti-Bullying Week – 15<sup>th</sup> November

Anti-Bullying Week is coordinated in England and Wales by the Anti-Bullying Alliance. It will be taking place during the week commencing 15th November. To signify the start of this week it we will be having 'Odd Socks Day' at school. The children will be asked to come to school wearing odd socks. This is a fun and great way to open a discussion about what makes us all unique!

Over the week we will be discussing what bullying is, where it takes place and who the children can talk to if they are being bullied. The theme for the week is One Kind Word. We will be exploring kindness and how we can show acts of kindness both in and out of school.

We are very much looking forward to taking part in the campaign and sharing our learning with you.

These Parents' Evenings will be an opportunity for you to discuss how your child has settled this year and how we can work together to support them further.

A parents' guide to logging on is also attached to this newsletter. **Please do sign up for your appointment by 23.55 on Monday, 15**<sup>th</sup> **November, at which point the system will close to new appointments.** If you are unable to attend one of those evenings, please do email the School Office to make a telephone appointment with your child's class teacher.

If your child is on the SEND register or you have concerns about your child and would like to make an **appointment to meet with Kerry Bedford, the school SENCo**, there is availability to book via School Cloud. She is available on Tuesday, 16<sup>th</sup> November, 3.30pm – 5.30pm (in the school hall) and Thursday, 18<sup>th</sup> November, 3.45pm – 5.30pm (via School Cloud). She will be giving 15 minute appointments and would ideally like you to make an appointment with

the class teacher first, followed by herself, where possible. This will allow for an overall update from the class teacher before discussing additional concerns you may have. Concerns may relate to academic progress, emotional well-being, additional needs and possible referrals to outside agencies. She can also advise on parental and family support outside of school (please also see end of newsletter for advice and support).

### Lunchtime Club – Thursdays

Thursday's lunchtime club started this week so children can come in at lunchtime for half an hour to read books, play games, draw or colour. It was very popular, even spilling out into the corridors!



### News from EYFS (Silver Birch Class)

We have been finding out about the seasons and noticing signs of Autumn on a lovely crisp Autumn walk. The children have created some beautiful Autumn inspired work using pastels and exploring using printing. What an exciting start to the term!



### News from Year 1 (Elm Class)

In Elm Class this week we have been learning about the 5th November and Guy Fawkes. We created our own firework pictures using different media such as paint, glue, glitter, chalks, crayons and much more. We have made our own Guy and have our very own pretend bonfire in our outside area. In PE we have been pirates and played pop up pirate whereby we balanced as many bean bags as we could on our friend before they 'POPPED!' We have also been very busy practising our number skills using the part whole model to help us solve addition number sentences. It has been a very busy week!



### News from Year 2 (Cherry Class)

We have also been looking at maps and globes to find places in the world and have started our learning of the polar regions. I know it is early but we have also begun learning a few Nativity songs. ### News from Year 4 (Willow Class)

Year 4 have begun their new topic, which is all about the weather! We have been watching the weather forecast each day and updating our class display with the temperature and wind speed. We have also learnt about ways to measure different weather, and have made paper windmills to help us understand the direction and speed of the wind. We have put them outside the office so that we can see them each day.



### News from Year 5 (Elder Class)

Year 5 and Year 4 enjoyed a shadow puppet workshop yesterday, led by Wishworks. They started by learning about how light refracts through a prism, before going on to make shadow puppets to re-tell the story of Rama and Sita to mark Diwali, which was yesterday. Diwali is celebrated by Hindus and Sikhs, which are focus religions in Year 4 and Year 5. This week, Year 5 also had a fantastic time with the Year 6s at Branching Out. They all challenged themselves and built on their resilience. It was lovely to see how supportive they all were of each other too. We were very proud of the conduct of all the children who took part. We have also enjoyed starting our new Earth and Space topic this week. We have begun by taking part in a webinar about space travel, and the class has also started a new unit of space-themed poetry, featuring poems by Pie Corbett and Walter De La Mare.



#### News from Year 6 (Oak Class)

Year 6 have begun Term 2 reaching for the sky - and quite literally! On Tuesday both Year 5 and 6 had a fantastic visit to Branching Out which was focused on their current term's school value: resilience. The children were extremely supportive of one another, offering buckets of encouragement to their peers as well as facing their own challenges. The children had so much fun, the autumnal weather was stunning and most of all everyone came back beaming with happiness and achievement.

This week, Year 6 are learning about the key enquiry question: 'What is History?'. There were some lovely elements of discussion whereby children challenged the different ways in which we speak about the past. Key language like: happened, ago, past, previous and even then vs now become debatable topics. Children were then allowed to draw on the tables (in washable pen!) to complete timelines based upon: people, dates, evidence, place and events. It was lovely to the children engaging and challenging the diversity and equality of their timeline, adding in areas like the equality act, equal pay act and the right for women to vote. It was clear the children were quite shocked and surprised at how recent these dates were. Overall, it was a really powerful lesson to be a part of and it was lovely to see the children challenging diversity and equality as a part of history- reaching beyond the curriculum.



### **Green United Depot Film Project**

A huge well done to Liam and Oliver (Year 6) and Joseph and Jacomo (previous Year) who were chosen, along with a small group of other children across Lewes, to take part in the Depots Green Film Project. The children made four short films, using a range of techniques to educate and publicise a range of environmental issues. Children from EYFS, Year 1, Year 2, Year 3 and Year 4 met some hedgehogs and learned about this endangered species, also discussing things like hibernation, dangers of bonfire night etc. The visits happened in the school hall - children sat in a circle around a Perspex enclosure so that they could all see the hedgehogs clearly. Everyone learned lots, and the children behaved beautifully, ensuring they were quiet so the hedgehogs were not stressed. Ethan from Year 6 presented Graham with the donations for Saint Francis Animal Care – we raised an impressive £128! A big thank you to everybody who contributed.

If your child is in Years 3 – 6, they are able to order a daily lunch through Chartwells. Each meal costs £2.15 which is payable in advance via ParentPay. If you child orders a school lunch, particularly on a daily basis, please ensure your ParentPay account is kept either cleared or in credit each week (as would happen as your child moves on to secondary school). It is taking a lot of time to ensure all parents and carers pay their lunch bills on a timely basis each week. Thank you.
