Reading/Writing/ Phonics

Read 'Zog' ever day by Julia Donaldson each day to your child. The animated version can be found on BBC iPlayer at the moment if you don't have a copy.

On Monday's literacy sheet can you think of words to describe Zog. Imagine your friend has never read the story what words would you use to describe him. These words can be what he looks like but also to include his personality.

Phonics-See Monday phonics. You are revising the digraph 'nk'.
