Staffing

E-safety Evening

Thank you to all of the parents, carers and staff who attended our first ever E-Safety evening. We are also extremely grateful to Paul Platts who was able provided the information, materials and delivery of this session. This well-attended event raised our awareness about a number of E-Safety areas: such as apps that make it very easy to locate people based on photos that are not private, the location of devices and the need to show an interest in what children are doing and accessing online.

While expanding our understanding of this fast changing area of risk, Paul reminded us educating children in the area of E-Safety is at its essence no different to ensuring they behaviour responsibly and safely when around water or out without adult supervision; engagement and discussion about their online behaviour remains our best defence against harm. In supporting these discussions Paul provided a number of websites that can help support discussion, make you more aware of the risks that children are exposed to and how to manage these without creating unmanageable restrictions to online behaviour. Some of these sites will form a part of the new E-Safety tab on the website, launching in time for half-term, a full list accompanies this newsletter.

Elm Class have been learning about The Three Little Pigs. We acted out the story in groups, changing one event.



News From Larch Class

Larch Class have been learning about how fossils are formed in their Science topic of Rocks and Soils. We enjoyed creating our own fossils by making imprints in clay and covering with plaster of paris. Once dried, we were able to 'excavate' our fossils. The results were striking as you can see.



News From Willow Class

In Science, Willow class have been learning about 'States of Matter.' We have carried out experiments in class where we investigated how long it took to melt different solids. We found out that out of ice, chocolate, wax and butter, the wax melted the quickest. Ask children in Willow class why they think this is, using their excellent scientific knowledge and vocabulary.



In addition to this, many children carried out experiments at home. Charlie left a lid filled with water outside overnight and in the morning it had frozen. It began to melt at school and all the water has now evaporated. Ewan froze water and tested to see how long it took for the ice to melt.

Oak Class have celebrated their 'Marvellous Middle' of the topic Germany – a country focus.
