

Home learning tasks- guide for grown ups- 20.4.20

Reading/Writing/ Phonics

Read 'Room on a Broom' every day to your child. The animated version can be found on BBC iPlayer at the moment if you don't have a copy. As the days go on, see if they can join in with parts of the story that they remember, or put on voices for the different characters.

Lit- Can you draw a story map showing the key points of the story? Who was on the broomstick first? Which animal got on it next? You can either just draw pictures showing the order of the story or if you want to challenge yourself you can caption each picture.

Phonics- Under Witch's Spell. Please see the attached sheet, Here are some words you can use to help your child practice their spellings. All the words use an 'a' sound. You could ask your child to draw pictures of them or come up with their own words that have the same sound. If your child is writing them down, don't forget to 'look, cover, write, check'. For an extra challenge could your child write a sentence using the 'a' words.
