

Home learning tasks- guide for grown ups- 1.5.20

Reading/Writing/ Phonics

Read 'Zog' with your child by Julia Donaldson and Axel Scheffler. If you do not have a copy, then you can watch the BBC version on BBC iplayer or Amazon Prime. You can also listen to the story read aloud on You Tube- <https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=qZqFqI0MAfU>

Also, see if you can find any other books about Knights, Princesses or Dragons. Discuss how the characters in the different texts are similar/ different. For example, how is the princess in Zog different from Cinderella?

Draw and label a castle. Design which features you would like to have if you were going to live there. Would you have a drawbridge and a moat? Would you have a cinema and a tennis court?!

Phonics- Have a go at the attached worksheet. Ask your child to find all the tricky words in the picture and read them. A tricky word is a word that cannot be read by blending the sounds so you just have to remember what it looks like. If you can't print the worksheet, you could look at it on the screen then write them out for your child to read. Alternatively, you could write out all the words and hide them around your house, then have a scavenger hunt to look for them all.

Continue to get your child to read with you as much as possible. You can create an account on the Oxford Owl website and access lots of free ebooks. We would have been reading book bands 1,2,3 mostly at school. <https://home.oxfordowl.co.uk/books/free-ebooks/>
