Stop motion animation.

Stop-motion was the first form of animation and is still used very widely today. Films such as Wallace and Gromit and Chicken Run still use stop-motion today! It is a series of pictures put together, where each scene moves a tiny bit, to create the image that they are moving. You can make animations using clay, people, toys or tin foil.

You will need:

- A camera (could be a digital camera or even a phone or ipad!)
- A tripod or something to hold the camera still in place (you could use books or boxes)
- An animation program on the computer (FilmoraPro, Dragonframe, Stop Motion Studio, Frames, iKITmovie)
- Materials to make a scene and props
- Your tin foil characters or other objects to use as characters.
- A story board.

Instructions:

- 1. Create a storyboard, plan out your story and how you are going to work each picture to create the story. I would keep it short to practice first and then make it longer. Maybe the first time you make a film it could just be two people walking down the street and greeting each other.
- 2. Create your scenes and figures. This could be making 3D objects like trees, buildings, cars and animals or making a backdrop with a piece of paper. You should have 3D characters (using clay, foil or dolls) which can be moved around.
- 3. Time to get started. Put the figure in front of the scene and set up the camera (making sure it doesn't move) You could blu tack the camera to a table.
- 4. Using your storyboard to help you, take a picture of your first scene.
- 5. Then move the figure a little bit and take your next picture.
- 6. Move it again, and take another picture until you have finished your story.
- 7. If you want a certain point in your animation to be longer, just take lots of pictures of the same movement.
- 8. Once you get the hang of it, you can add more characters, change the scene and make your film a bit longer.

Putting it together:

- 1. Once you have all your photos, upload them onto your computer. Make sure you know which program you want to use (there is lots of free ones, it's worth having a look at a few)
- 2. Most programs come with a tutorial but the main thing you want to do is put the pictures in the correct order.
- 3. You might want to add a voice over, music, titles or credits at the end.
- 4. Make it as simple or as complicated as you like! It will be amazing ©
