Arctic Tern



- Arctic terms have the longest migration journey of any bird.
- They spend most of their time flying.
- They land once every 1 to 3 years to nest.
- They fly from the Arctic to the
- Antarctic every year and then fly back.
- They have perfect wings for flying long distances.

Weddel Seal



- Weddell seals live further south than any other mammal.
- They live in holes in the ice breathing through the gaps.
- Every year the females come out from under the ice to give birth to baby seals called pups.
- They feed on fish, squid and krill.
- Young Weddell seals love to play fight.

Emperor Penguin



- Penguins cannot fly.
- Instead of wings penguins have flippers to help them swim in the water.
- They can stay underwater for up to 20 minutes.
- Emperor penguins are the biggest penguin out of 17 species.
- Their colours help keep them camouflaged in the sea.
- They huddle together to keep warm in large groups.

Orca



- · Also known as killer whales.
- They aren't whales, they are the largest of dolphins.
- They can weigh up to 6 tonnes.
- They can grow to be as long as a bus.
- They can live up to 80 years old.
- Their black and white colouring acts as camouflage underwater.
- They are one of the world's most powerful predators.
