Reading/Writing/ Phonics

Read 'Pirates love underpants by Claire Freedman with your child. If you do not have a copy, then here is a version read aloud on You Tube.

After listening to the story again can you draw a map of the journey the pirates took before finding the 'Pants of Gold' Remember all the different places they went and writing describing words about the places; arriving on the beach, over the bridge, through the swamps and the undergrowth.
