Capital letters

Capital letters are used....

1. At the beginning of a sentence.

The dog ran outside.

2. For names of  
people Miss Blackwell  
places Lewes  
days Monday  
months January

3. When we use I to talk about ourselves.

I was really happy when I saw the sun in the sky.

1. Full stop .

2. An exclamation mark !

1. Full stop .

Most of our sentences will end with a full stop.  
The dog had a bone.



2. An exclamation mark !

Sentences that are telling us something exciting have an exclamation point.  
The dog was digging as fast as he could to bury his bone!



3. A question mark ?

Sentences that ask a question need a question mark.  
Does the dog have a bone?

Now we are going to look at speech marks.

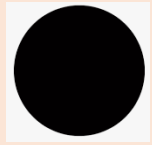
These are used to show when someone is talking.
