
Year Six PGL Windmill Hill Residential

News from School Council

We have been discussing our 'Reducing Plastic' project. We would like to ask you to make an 'eco-brick' over half term and bring it back to school by Friday 7th of June. An eco-brick is a building block made entirely from unrecyclable plastic. It's created by filling a plastic bottle with clean, dry plastic until it's packed tightly and can be used as a building block.

Eco-bricks can be used in all sorts of sustainable building projects, which makes them a great way to dispose of plastic waste that would otherwise end up in landfill, and potentially, the ocean.



As a School Council, we will then decide what we will do with the Eco-Bricks (for example, create an art sculpture or display) before taking them to be reused in the summer.

Staffing arrangements next year

As many of you know, there will be a number of staffing changes next year. I will be in a position to give you more information about the new teachers we have recently appointed after the half term break. In the meantime however, I am pleased to be able to confirm that the school has arranged for a senior teacher from Iford and Kingston Primary School to act as our Deputy Head teacher from September. Louisa Adams is an experienced teacher who will be seconded for the first two terms. She will teach in Year 6 for three days per week and work alongside Mrs Wooler for the remaining two days per week. Once the Governors have appointed a permanent Head teacher they will then appoint a permanent Deputy and of course, Mrs Adams will be able to apply.

I will be able to provide more information about staffing arrangements for September (and which teachers will work in which year groups) early next term.

Scooters and bikes

We have had a couple of scooters go missing from the bike shed recently, belonging to Clara and Ben in Years 2 and 4. Ben's is silver and Clara's is bright blue with an orange break pad.
